SUNDAY MEDITATION

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Year C Deuteronomy 30:10-14. Psalm 68(69):14.17.30-31.33-34.36-37 Colossians 1:15-20. Luke 10:25-37

The one who treated him with mercy. (Luke 10:37)

Jesus' listeners must have been surprised by this parable. Jews looked down on Samaritans, but in this story, it is the Samaritan, not the priest or the Levite. who treats the injured man with mercy. The Samaritan is the one who loves his neighbor and takes care of him.

Jesus' message is clear: "Go and do likewise" (Luke 10:37). But the Church Fathers saw this parable as more than an example of how we should love our neighbor. They saw Jesus as the good Samaritan, the One who has come to care for each of us who have been battered by sin and the powers of evil. He is the One who finds us lying "halfdead" by the side of the road (Luke 10:30). And he is the One who bandages our wounds and carries us to the "inn." the Church.

This allegorical reading can deepen our understanding of this very familiar parable. Through Jesus' death and resurrection, he has healed us of the wounds of our sin. Now recovered and sustained by the Church's sacraments. we can be the good Samaritans who join the Lord in caring for those people who are still on the side of the road and in need of rescue. And because we are fellow travelers who know what it's like to be wounded by sin and rescued by the Lord, we can show them the same mercy that we have received.
